Genesis 9: 8-17 NIV

⁸ Then God said to Noah and to his sons with him: ⁹ “I now establish my covenant with you and with your descendants after you ¹⁰ and with every living creature that was with you—the birds, the livestock and all the wild animals, all those that came out of the ark with you—every living creature on earth. ¹¹ I establish my covenant with you: Never again will all life be destroyed by the waters of a flood; never again will there be a flood to destroy the earth.”

Durham Cathedral is offering a couple of additional opportunities to grow, which we can also take up as a recommitment to our discipleship. This last year has reminded us that even though travel has been restricted we are very much part of an international community. The first offering is a series of Lenten Addresses at the **Sunday Choral Evensong at 3:30pm "Saints for Our Time: keeping the rumour of God alive"**.

These will be on the lives and witness of five twentieth century holy people – from five continents:

Sunday 21 February – Rutilio Grande (1928-1977), Jesuit Priest and Martyr in El Salvador – The Americas

Sunday 28 February – Janani Luwum (1922-1977), Anglican Archbishop and Martyr in Uganda – Africa

Sunday 7 March – Esther of Melbourne (1858-1931), Anglican Religious and Missionary in Australia

Sunday 14 March – Maximilian Kolbe (1894-1941), Roman Catholic Priest and Martyr in Poland– Europe


Sunday 21 March – Teresa of Calcutta (1910-1997), Roman Catholic Religious and Missionary in India

The second is linking up with St George's College in Jerusalem and their Lent Course 'A River Through The Desert', which focuses on the physical features of the Holy Land to explore our faith through Lent in Six Sessions.

This is an exciting and stimulating course using video clips from the Holy Land. In medieval times when international pilgrimages became difficult, places such as Westminster Abbey (Jerusalem Chamber), Walsingham (the English Nazareth) and of course Durham (the Galilee Chapel) named and celebrated their links with the Holy Land.
