From the Home Front



I am very much a visual person – I think and imagine in pictures, and I often feel that God uses what I see around me every day to talk to me. As I travelled around New Zealand I frequently saw visual metaphors for our Christian walk through life...

My sister and I were driving to a town about 30 miles away by a different route. We followed the signposts knowing they would get us there. As we drove along the road became narrower and we went up into a range of hills. We turned a corner and suddenly the tarred road disappeared! We were driving on a bumpy gritted road, miles from anywhere, no houses to be seen, no other vehicles, no more road signs. We had to slow down, but we were certain this was the correct route, so we cautiously continued. We had to be careful – gritted hilly roads can be slippery and although we initially could see the road ahead, the sides of the road were steep edged with trees in places and had ditches alongside.



At points along our way there were deep water filled potholes to be avoided plus we had to take additional care as the road had sharp bends and we had no idea what was around them!



We met a huge tractor with a trailer of equipment and had to pull our large truck as far into the side as we could manage (avoiding ditch and trees), in order for it to pass us on the narrow track without a collision. This challenging drive lasted for about 15 miles before we rounded a corner and re-joined a tarred road, passed a farm, then for the last couple of miles we drove on a 'proper' two way marked road once more.



I felt as if this whole journey equated to life. I have the directions - my faith and the word of God and Jesus in the Bible. I journey along safely with support from church, friends and family. But unexpected events can change the look of the journey at any time. My life may need to slow down as all the usual parameters change, I may need to overcome dangers, challenges and even

potential disasters, trusting always that I know my direction is correct and I must stay with it... Even when I have no idea how long I will be on this difficult route I know that at some point everything will once again return to 'normal', the road will become easier and possible twists and turns will be more obvious and can be avoided.

Trusting in the promises of God, following His word is a map to navigate life's roads, knowing that you are being directed and led (even when it seems no one is there!), by a Father who loves and cares for you more than you do for yourself.

It is Finished

It's good Friday, I had been at a reflection of the cross in our church. After the service had ended I knelt at the foot of the crude wooden cross, I looked up to see long nails sticking out exactly where Jesus hands and feet would have been. I imagined Jesus hanging there and his blood dripping on to my head. The words going over and over in my mind were .

"It is finished". The very words that Jesus our Saviour cried out after hanging in agony on the cross. John Ch 19: 30 'When he had received the drink, Jesus said "It is finished". With that he bowed his head and gave up his spirit.'

What did He mean when He said those words? Jesus died so that we could have life, life in all its fullness.

John 10:10 'The thief comes only to steal kill and destroy. I have come that they have life and have it to the full.'

Jesus died so that we could be cleansed and forgiven. 1 John Ch 1:9 'If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just and will forgive us our sins and purify us from all unrighteousness.'

Jesus died so that we could be healed. Isaiah Ch 53: 5 'But he was pierced for our transgressions, he was crushed for our iniquities.'

The punishment that brought us peace was on Him, and by His wounds we are healed.

Jesus died so we would no longer be condemned. Romans Ch 8:1 'Therefore there is now no condemnation for those who are in Christ Jesus.' How often do you and I live under this cloak of condemnation? Constantly second guessing if Jesus does forgive us, if He really did take the guilt of our sin.

Our lives would look so different if we lived from Jesus words "It is finished" Instead of walking towards the cross constantly wondering if we could do anything to rid ourselves of guilt and shame. Wondering if we could make ourselves worthy of his love. What if we walk from the cross knowing that He paid the ultimate price and took it all on Himself.

This Easter let's worship our risen saviour and live in the freedom that Jesus died for. Galatians Ch 5:1 'It is for freedom that Christ has set us free. Stand firm then and do not let yourselves be burdened again by a yoke of slavery.'

James was born on 28th March 1961. He was the 4th and youngest child. James lived in Hartlepool all his life but his birth certificate does state he was born in a Newcastle Hospital.

He went to Grange Primary school and after passing his 11 plus he attended the Grammar school. He did like sports and played rugby. After school he went into Mental Health Training. His first job was in Winterton Hospital, a psychiatric hospital north of Sedgfield. He then worked in different hospitals, St Luke's in Middlesbrough and also James Cook. James did attend Stranton Church, he meet his wife Lisa at the church Youth Group.

It was at a Hartlepool football game, over the noise of the crowd that James proposed to Lisa. She said 'Yes', and even though her mum has a bit unsure because Lisa was only 19, they were married on 9th May 1987, in Stranton Church.

That event was also recorded in the Hartlepool Mail, because it was a wedding that had been taken by a lady Deacon called Christine Streeter. Quite unusual in those days.

James got a new job in James Cook Hospital and he had completed his

first day well. The second day he couldn't go to work because Kate was born in James Cook Hospital and James was in the office asking for permission to have a few days holiday.

Their holidays didn't stop, they just took Kate with them. There was another trip to Africa but while there Kate became poorly and they had to take her to hospital. This hospital had poor facilities and someone advised them to move Kate to a military private hospital, which they did, and Kate recovered.

Lisa would suggest going on holiday to places like Alaska or India and she did ask James where do you want to go on holiday. James said 'how about Cornwall!'. That became a running joke whenever they discussed holidays.

James loved having pets and especially a dog. He would go for really long walks with the dog.

Another thing James loved was watching cricket, He even took me to Chester le Street cricket ground to watch an England game. Kate worked out that James became so engrossed with the game she could ask him to agree to things that he may have usually said no to.

The Lawson household was known for its social parties. They had a Doctor Who party and Lisa was dressed as Tom Baker. They had Eurovision parties, again people dressed up. All except James. He would keep himself busy with the BBQ or being the drinks man.

James was a family man devoted to Lisa and Kate. He was very protective of them. He was a quiet man who didn't like a fuss and he had a dry sense of humour. He liked to just spring information on people, an example of that would be when King Charles was on TV, he announced 'I have met him, he came to open up a hospital wing or something'. He meet him years ago but it was just a few weeks the family got to hear about it?

He loved Stranton church he was a regular attender. One thing he liked to do was time the preacher and tell them how long they had been. Kate attended church on Easter Sunday. This was because James had bought all the children in church an Easter egg, and Kate wanted to give them out. That sums up both James and his family very well.

James and Lisa have now been re-united in Heaven with their God who loves them and calls them his own.



Bereavement Support Update

Those who are interested in being involved in the proposed Bereavement Support Group attended a meeting in St Matthew's Community Centre on 1st April. Eleven people from Stranton and St Luke's attended and two others from St Aidan's have also expressed interest in the group, but were not able to attend the meeting. This was an amazing turnout and was very encouraging, showing that there is a belief amongst members of all our churches that there is (or at least may be) a need for bereavement support. Revd John was there to give support and guidance and it proved to be a very productive time in which to share ideas and gain a general sense of the purpose and feel of the venture.

It was envisaged that the group's meetings would initially be on a monthly basis and would be very informal, giving people, of all faiths or none, suffering from any sort of bereavement, whether recent or in the past, a safe space to talk and listen to each other. We decided that the small hall at St Matthew's Community Centre would be an appropriate venue, as it would afford an informal setting with small tables arranged for people to sit in small groups, with access to tea/coffee making facilities.

Going forward, we agreed the following steps:

- To make contact with the Hospice for advice

- To investigate whether or not other churches in the diocese offer this sort of service



- To look into the issue of safeguarding



Summer Fayre


We are holding our Summer Fayre on Saturday June 17th - well known for bargains galore!!!


