## **Questions** ?????

I am running an Alpha course in church, this is a course put together by Nicky Gumbel and he also teaches on the videos we watch. One part of the video shows them going onto the streets and asking people a question. We then see the people's responses and what you notice is they all seem to have different ideas as to what the answer to the question might be. For example "Who is Jesus?" A selection of answers were:- A man Herod killed, A good man who lived a long time ago, There was no such person, He is meant to be son of God, I don't know!

The first thing you have to recognise is that people will have a variety of thoughts and ideas, which don't match up - and that is alright. We are all different and we all think differently as well.

The second thing is that all the people who were asked the question, also had lots of questions they wanted to ask. The Alpha course is said to be based on these types of people, and it is a course where you come to ask questions? We discuss the answers together. We don't always have all the answers!

In the time of Jesus people often became disciples of a leader, they literally followed him, watched him and listened to him. They were also to bring questions and observations to him. A rabbi was a person people followed and there were many rabbis. Jesus himself became a rabbi to his disciples. What we often saw with Jesus was when someone asked him a question, he would reply with another question, rather than an answer.

"By what authority are you doing these things?" they asked. "And who gave you authority to do this?" Jesus replied, "I will ask you one question. Answer me, and I will tell you by what authority I am doing these things. John's baptism - was it from heaven, or of human origin? Tell me!" Mark 11v 28-30.

It is by asking questions that you find the answers and so you start to learn new things and different concepts. In school I have taken a few RE lessons and it is great to have questions asked by the children as the teaching can often go deeper because of the questions which they asked.

I do think that some people think it is wrong to question God? But is it really wrong, to ask God a question? God is beyond our imaginations, His brain must be massive compared to mine. So I don't think God is upset when someone questions Him. After all, it is then an opportunity for God to give an answer. I understand that some people might be uncomfortable by some of the questions asked? But they would be so varied.

Why do Giraffes have such long legs? Why do we have suffering in the world? Why does England have four seasons of weather in one day? Is my grandma in heaven? Is there life on other planets?

"Before a word is on my tongue you, Lord, know it completely." Psalm 139 v 4 I may feel uncomfortable asking God a question, yet this verse tells us that God knows the question in our mind before we have even verbalised it? I would like to know how He does that? I think I will ask Him!! God loves to communicate with His children, asking a question is a great way to get the conversation started, so go on, and ask God a question today.

Dear Sisters and Brothers,

Peace I leave with you, my peace I give to you. I do not give to you as the world gives. Do not let your hearts be troubled and do not let them be afraid.

John 14.27

Many of us will have troubled hearts as we watch with horror the attack by Russia on Ukraine. As we have already said, this attack is an act of evil, imperilling as it does the relative peace and security that Europe has enjoyed for so long. The attack by one nation on a free, democratic country has rightly provoked outrage, sanctions and condemnation.

We lament with the people of Ukraine, and we pray for the innocent, the frightened and those who have lost loved ones, homes, and family. We continue to call for a ceasefire and the withdrawal of Russian forces as well as wide-ranging efforts to ensure peace, stability and security.

These events remind us powerfully that peace is precious and it is fragile. In Chapter 14 of John's Gospel, Jesus speaks to his disciples at the Last Supper and he leaves them his peace. This is not a mere greeting, but rather something deep and abiding. This peace is something that only Jesus gives; for it is a gratuitous gift, a way of living, something to be received for the gift of peace is the gift of Jesus himself. That is why the Lord is able to offer reassurance to our hearts, why those who receive the gift of the peace of Jesus Christ at the deepest of levels should not be afraid.

Peace, therefore, is so much more than the absence of war. It is a gift, and it is also a decision, a gift that must be received. It is a choice we make that shapes the way we live well alongside each other. It characterises our relationship with God. It comes into being by seeking justice.

In these days of uncertainty and fear, we pray that each of us might again turn to the Lord and receive God's gift of peace, work for God's justice, know God's reconciliation and love, and choose paths not of hatred or destruction, of violence or retribution, but God's way of justice, mercy and peace.

As Christians, our response to a crisis must always be rooted in prayer. And so we invite you to join with us in praying most earnestly for an outpouring of the Spirit of God, that the world may once again choose peace, strengthening those international bodies that enable us to work and live together as one humanity inhabiting one world.

We pray for those in Ukraine who suffer grievously, for all who take decisions around the world, and for the people and leaders of Russia too.

## **Alphabet of Gardening tips**

I was given a little book of gardening tips "Green fingers and dirty nails", when I was in New Zealand, which I thought I would share with you over the months - J.A.R.

#### T

Tomatoes enjoy the company of asparagus, basil, cabbage, carrots, onions, parsley, peas and sage but dislike fennel and potatoes. Tomatoes need a well drained sunny spot. Set young plants in the soil so that their lowest leaves are just above soil level.

Give tulips an artificial winter ---- put them (labelled so you will not mistake for them vegetables) in the crisper drawer of fridge for six weeks.

Tulip bulbs are flat on one side. If you are growing them in pots, place the flat side outwards as it is from there the leaf comes. That way you will get a symmetrical display.

When arranging tulips do you have a problem in keeping the stems straight? Roll each bloom in wet newspaper and soak overnight.




Ward Jackson Primary School

## Birds of a Feather

On the beach with my dog Ember this morning, near the rocks opposite the Staincliffe Hotel, I noticed that lots of gulls were stationary among the rocks. They were just standing very still. The weather forecast was for another storm with very strong winds and even snow. These gulls were mostly herring gulls and a few black headed gulls in their winter plumage (black spot on head).

The day before, driving along Brenda Road near to the Tees Bay Retail Park, I passed the remnants of the water ponds from the steelworks and was astonished by the number of coots and gulls feeding there. Our ancestors were much more canny than us. They read these signs of birds and other animals' behaviour and interpreted the weather that way. During these times of lockdowns and warnings of bad storms the birds have been a weather forecaster for me. In the Bible birds were important – in Genesis God hovered over the face of the waters like a dove, birds bringing bread to the prophets and birds of the sky, neither reaping or sowing. The bird mentioned first in the Old Testament is the raven, but the bird with the most appearances is the dove (over 50 times); a gentle bird.

So take note of our birds, whether in your garden or on a beach and wonder what they are trying to tell you!

## **Recipes**

#### **Date Bars**

1 packet of dates
1 x 250g of rich tea biscuits or ginger biscuits
225g margarine
1 cup of sugar
2 eggs beaten
Vanilla essence

Chop dates, melt marg & stir over a gentle heat until dates are softened Add sugar & mix well Remove from heat & add beaten eggs Crush biscuits to a powder & add vanilla essence, then stir into dates Press into a greased lined swiss roll tin, chill in fridge, then cut into squares. Store in fridge

### **Grilled Red Peppers**

4 ripe red peppers salt & ground black pepper 125g goat's cheese optional sprinkling of Mediterranean herbs 8 cherry tomatoes or fresh basil to serve 2 tablespoons olive oil

Wash red peppers & cut in half lengthwise-cut through stalks so each half has some stalk attached.

Remove the seeds & lay halved peppers on a baking tray Cut the goat's cheese into 8 thin rounds & put a round into each half pepper

Cut each cherry tomato & put 2 halves in each pepper half Drizzle each pepper with olive oil & sprinkle with herbs Place in hot oven 200C/180C fan/Gas 6 for 20 minutes until the pepper halves are really soft, the cheese melted & bubbling & the tomatoes well grilled.

Serve with salt & black pepper, crusty bread & a green salad.

In so doing we must understand there is a natural aversion to change and at all times strive to maintain harmony.


